Order Of Business

Chair: Previous minutes passed.

Bike donations:

2 balance bikes were donated to the club form a children's nursery in Guisborough. These can be stored in the container but we should make sure that things which are in there are being used. If balance bikes are not getting used then we can find another home for them. Sustrans are running a project for disadvantaged adults and would appreciate any bike donations or adult sized bikes

Container (possible relocation closer to circuit at bottom of steps)

Stockton Wheelers have confirmed they will not be receiving a new container and therefore will be keeping their existing one, This was driven by Cleveland Containers and makes a whole lot of sense although this does mean that there will not a crane vehicle arriving on site which would have moved our box at the same time. MSV do not seem to have an issue with where our container is currently situated so I would propose to leave it as it. If we feel the need to move it at a later stage (weather permitting) then we could engage a suitable haulier (Tom L had a suggestion of who could do this)

The plan is to build some racking and storage inside the container. John Horlock has offered some carpentry help in building. Shaun has some timber. This is likely a winter project.

Remaining equipment to be collected from Tanfield garage as will consolidate all club equipment in the container. Thanks to Stewart Tanfield for his support in housing things over the past few years. An annual donation was made to Stewart over the past years in October, but this will cease this year.

With a club subsidy this will bring jersey costs to just under 30 for an aero one and 20 for a gilet. Many thanks for the efforts to create the design and make it real. Now the task comes to generate interest and get some orders in to utilise the volume discount.

Welfare:

No welfare issues reported.

Met with Patrick Burney, the new Sports Welfare Officer based in Tees Valley Sport. His role is funded by Sport England & is a national project of 63 officers spread out across the country, working with key partners such as the NSPCC's Child Protection in Sport Unit & the Ann Craft Trust as well as the National Governing Bodies of multiple sports.

His role is to provide local assistance to clubs in meeting safeguarding responsibilities, and to provide knowledge and skills support - advice and guidance on safeguarding issues. He is also creating a network of Club Welfare Officers to help share what activities and training they are taking part in, as well as additional training from me and other Welfare Officers in the North East.

He came along to the Youth Coaching session on 09/09/24 at MSV and we talked through the set-up we have for Youth Coaching. He seemed generally impressed by our approach – objective ability-based groups, proper sign on process, email communication, clear parental guidelines, etc. One area which has not been covered in the past by WO is Adult safeguarding (as it is a new focus area) and as we run adult coaching sessions, he has suggested that we should look at training in this area. He has offered access to free training so I will look to complete this once I have dates.

Has also extended invitation to an online session on Monday 23rd September where he and the Sports Welfare Officers in County Durham, Tyne and Wear and Northumberland are running a call intended to share their works but also to create a network of support that WOs can draw on.

One area I am looking to explore is any information to help support autistic children to get the most from our sessions. He also extended the view that we should be proactive in sharing the WO contact details and guidance to parents on acceptable behaviour as this is often the area which creates issues

for children. We have done this through the L2000 sign- on, but I will work with Paul & Josef to look at how we provide updates on a regular basis for ongoing sessions.
